SECOND FLOOR APARTMENT, 3 ROYAL CRESCENT, BATH

A DELIGHTFUL ONE BEDROOM SECOND FLOOR APARTMENT WITHIN THIS RENOWNED GRADE I LISTED GEORGIAN CRESCENT WITH THE BENEFIT OF LOVELY SOUTH WESTERLY VIEWS AND A SINGLE GARAGE.

DESCRIPTION

A lovely second floor apartment at the start of The Royal Crescent, affording lovely elevated views of The Crescent and Royal Victoria Park in a south westerly direction. It has spacious accommodation, the main reception room having three large sash windows with their original wooden shutters and wrought iron balconettes. The kitchen opens into the dining area of the reception room, with access off the main hall, which in turn leads to the bathroom and the double bedroom at the rear of the building, with built in wardrobes. Of particular note is the benefit of a secure single garage that sits at the rear of the building.

SITUATION

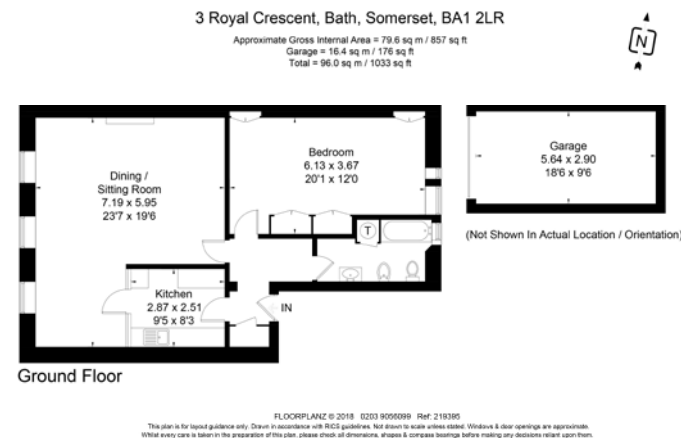
The Royal Crescent enjoys renown as the centrepiece of Bath's architectural heritage. Occupying a prime situation on Bath's lower northern slopes, it enjoys commanding views across the city to the south and neighbouring crescents and terraces to the north.

The Royal Crescent is a Grade I Listed semi elliptical crescent that was built by John Wood The Younger in 1767-75 and is one of the greatest examples of Georgian architecture to be found in the United Kingdom. It faces south, overlooking the crescent lawn, down across Royal Victoria Park. It has a renowned architectural appeal and an illustrious history of famous residents over the years.

Bath is a World Heritage site, famous for its Roman heritage and Georgian architecture. Bath offers a wealth of shopping, entertainment, leisure and cultural facilities as well as a mainline rail link to London Paddington (journey time approx 90 minutes) and Bristol Temple Meads (journey time approx 15 minutes). Junction 18 of the M4 motorway is approximately 10 miles to the north. There are excellent schools in both the private and state sectors, a short distance away - namely King Edwards Primary School, and the Royal High School and Kingswood on Lansdown.
